## From the Pastor

As we transition into Summer 2018, Southminster Church has much for which to be thankful. Last fall's recarpeting and refreshing in the Sanctuary, while not exactly intentional, ended up giving us much more flexibility than we ever envisioned. We can have a very traditional worship space (almost exactly as it was before the refresh with the exception of the front platform), or a really different "worship in the round" orientation if it suits our needs. That was a precursor to this spring's water heater burst in the rear of the building which led to a total refresh of the nursery and some additional work in my office. Because of the dedication of the Building and Grounds Team, we've stretched out our dollars far further than we thought possible.

During a period when we've lost some familiar faces, we have also been blessed with wonderful guest traffic in recent Sundays. In my experience, the reasons people choose to attend (or not) worship in a given place and time are complex. No single thing gives rise to new people in the life of a community. More likely, it is the confluence of multiple influences. For example, almost two years ago, the Nurture Team spearheaded a new direction for our youth discipleship and nurture: Discovery Zone. The initial enthusiasm eventually tempered itself to a fairly solid group who gathered weekly. The number of children who were a part of our community didn't change that first year, but of late Discovery Zone seems to have hit its stride and we've got a really solid group of pre-
elementary and young elementary age kids involved. Now, Southminster is a solid option for families with younger kids. That uptick has now spread into our general worship on Sunday.

Through the spring of this year, between 20 and 25 percent of our Sunday morning group is guests, people who don't worship with us on a "regular" basis. That has meant some adjustment to the music, liturgy and "style" of our worship. What was a theoretical conversation a few years ago ("what might church look like for people who weren't raised in our particular kind of church?") is now a very central consideration given the group gathered on Sundays for worship.

We come now to a season of rest. We've accomplished a lot, in some respects more than we could have imagined or asked for. The next few months are important: we have a smallish group of people who through their dedication and hard work project a much larger presence. For next fall to pick up where we are right now, we will need people who are willing to engage, to volunteer, to grow into new roles. For that to happen, we need to get some rest and refreshment in the weeks ahead. As we turn our attention to summer's concerns (traveling, recreation, new adventures), let us do so with grateful hearts for all God has done among us. Let us do so looking forward to what God will do with and among us in the church year to come.
