#### From The Pastor



We have a lofty mission statement at Southminster that starts out: The mission of the church is "to participate in what God is doing in our world by . . . ." This mission

statement is built on two assumptions: God is still at work in our world, and the "business" of the church is to discern where God is at work and work alongside and within that work. We've put this into practice this Advent season. The local schools know what is happening with families in the community; we asked them "is there anyone who needs help this Christmas season and what do they need?" The response was a list of families who could use a little help in this season. Those lists were very specific: clothing, practical needs (food, gas, home items), and some toys for the children. Just when we thought we had our list, they approached us again and said "wait, one more family please!" I can't tell you as a pastor how wonderful it was to see the people of Southminster respond to that request. You came up with creative ways to stretch your buying dollars, people from beyond the Southminster family got involved. We did exactly what we said we would do: we listened, we discerned, we acted.

For a number of years Southminster has participated in ChristNet over the Advent / Christmas holiday season. During the time I've served as pastor, we've helped facilitate a week at Journey of Hope Church in concert with several other churches in our community. This year we received a call from ChristNet, "we're really having trouble finding someone to host the shelter for those who don't have a place to sleep and eat over the Christmas holiday. Would you be willing to help?" Again we listened, discerned, and Session quite bravely said "yes" and set our acting into motion.

Most of the time, mission statements tend to be lofty words on paper or at best aspirational statements about the future. To be a small part of a community that moves beyond the aspirational and theoretical into the practical, to live out our mission statement over the past Advent season has been profoundly satisfying. Thank you for your willingness to listen, to discern, and to act. Together we have offered food, housing, fellowship, and hope. We have been Jesus' presence in our community for some people who

needed that presence in this season. When we listen, discern, and act, we become God's presence in our world. We give time and place to Emmanuel, the God who takes up residence among us.

Discovery Zone will not be held on December 29th or January 5th 2020, as our church will be hosting Christnet warming center for the homeless. Discovery Zone Children's Sunday school will resume on January 19th at 10am.

The adult Sunday school group are reading the book of Acts by N.T. Wright and will self-facilitate the discussions from their reading on Sunday morning at 10am.

Discovery Zone for the lower level through high school will be doing a four week study on the Temptations of Jesus beginning on January 19th continuing through February 9th.

Many weeks, your help has not been necessary due to the lack of nursery aged children in attendance, but please don't stop volunteering. If you are willing to share one hour a month with our littlest members, there is a sign-up sheet is available in fellowship hall on the Nurture board, opportunities to help are still available. Please sign up for January and February.

Appreciation also goes out to those volunteers that have signed up

to help with the children at the back table during worship. Children under second grade move to the back table after children's time in the worship service at 11am. It is suggested that two people team up and supervise them at the table. Sign up for your week in fellowship hall on the Nurture board, additional opportunities are still available. Youth volunteers may also sign up to assist our volunteers at the back table one week a month. Please sign up on the board in fellowship hall for January and February.

Sunday evening youth group meetings for the middle and high school aged youth are from 6-7:30pm. Rich Pratt is also the youth group director. The youth group has named itself the "Daring Disciples." 50 shirts have been ordered for the t-shirt fundraiser, in white with the logo imprinted on the front. The price is \$20. each.
